Authority Mission Statement and Performance Measurements

Name of Public Authority:

Huntington Community Development Agency (“HCDA”)

Public Authority's Mission Statement:

Established in 1977, the role of the Huntington Community Development Agency (“HCDA”) is to help meet the housing needs of low and moderate-income residents and assist with other services that improve the quality of life for those residents.

The HCDA further assists the community with programs that seek to curtail blight, promote economic and job opportunities and maintain and restore Huntington’s neighborhoods and downtown business districts.

HCDA’s main funding source is the federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program, administered by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

List of HUD-based Performance Goals:

1. Improve the condition of existing housing for owner-occupied households occupied by extremely low, very low and low to moderate-income families.
2. Increase the supply of affordable owner-occupied housing for very low and low to moderate-income households.
3. Increase the supply of affordable, renter-occupied housing for extremely low, very low and low to moderate-income households.
4. Facilitate the location of housing for the homeless and households with special needs.
5. Expand employment opportunities for low to moderate-income persons.
6. Increase public facilities to low and moderate-income families.
