RESOLUTION SCHEDULING A PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER ADOPTING LOCAL LAW INTRODUCTORY No. 17 –2012, AMENDING THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF HUNTINGTON, CHAPTER 117 (SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT: COLLECTION, RECYCLING AND DISPOSAL) §117-28 RE: FEES FOR USE OF TOWN FACILITIES

WHEREAS, Huntington Town Code §117-28(A) provides that all solid waste delivered to the Town's disposal facilities, the Huntington Resource Recovery Facility ("facility") being the only Town facility that currently accepts non-recyclable solid waste, be charged a tip fee of \$75 per ton; and

WHEREAS, the Town has employed all possible cost-reducing and revenue-enhancing measures to forestall any increase in said fee to cover the facility's cost; and

WHEREAS, the last such increase in the tip fee raised the fee from \$65 per ton to \$75 per ton and was enacted by Local Law 39-2004; and

WHEREAS, since that time and pursuant to the Service Agreement with Covanta Huntington, L.P., the facility's operating expenses have increased with said increase being approximately 6%; and

WHEREAS, increasing revenue generated by tipping fees is presently the only means of defraying the facility's costs; and

WHEREAS, to regain parity with these increased costs, an increase in the tip fee, from \$75 and to \$80 per ton, is needed to increase revenues to cover the facility's cost; and

WHEREAS, this amendment of the Town Code is a Type II action pursuant to 6 N.Y.C.R.R. 617.5(c)(20) and (c)(27), and therefore, no further SEQRA review is required.

Section 1. Amendment to Chapter 117 (Solid Waste Management-Collection, Recycling and Disposal) of the Code of the Town of Huntington, §117-28 (Fees for use of Town facilities), is hereby amended to read as follows:

CHAPTER 117  
SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT:  
COLLECTION, RECYCLING AND DISPOSAL

§117-28. Fees for use of Town facilities.

A. Acceptable waste. The fee for the delivery of solid waste to any Town facility shall be [seventy (\$75.)] eighty (\$80) dollars per ton and shall be payable for all delivered acceptable waste, regardless of its origin or by whom delivered.

Section 2. Effective Date.

This Local Law shall take effect upon filing in the Office of the Secretary of State of the State of New York, but in no event earlier than January 1, 2013.

RESOLUTION SCHEDULING A PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER ADOPTING LOCAL LAW INTRODUCTORY NO. 18-2012 AMENDING THE UNIFORM TRAFFIC CODE OF THE TOWN OF HUNTINGTON, CHAPTER I (GENERAL PROVISIONS), CHAPTER 2 (TRAFFIC REGULATIONS), CHAPTER 3 (PARKING REGULATIONS) AND CHAPTER 4 (PARKING FIELDS)

WHEREAS, it is the intention of the Town Board to update parking standards and requirements of the Town, and redistribute use of existing parking to best meet the needs of commuters and other users; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to '617.5 (c)(20) and (7) of SEQRA, regulations amending the Uniform Traffic Code of the Town of Huntington are "routine or continuing agency administration and management, not including new programs or major reordering of priorities" and "promulgation of regulations, policies, procedures and legislative decisions in connection with any Type II action", and therefore, this proposal, a Type II action, requires no further action pursuant to SEQRA.

NOW, THEREFORE THE TOWN BOARD

HEREBY SCHEDULES a public hearing to be held on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of October, 2012 at 6:00 pm Huntington Town Hall, 100 Main Street, Huntington, New York, to consider adopting Local Law Introductory No. 18 -2012 amending the Uniform Traffic Code of the Town of Huntington, Chapter 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 2 (Traffic Regulations), Chapter 3 (Parking Regulations) and Chapter 4 (Parking Fields), inclusive of Schedule "L"; as follows:

BE IT ENACTED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF HUNTINGTON, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Amendment to the Uniform Traffic Code of the Town of Huntington, Chapter 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 2 (Traffic Regulations), Chapter 3 (Parking Regulations) and Chapter 4 (Parking Fields); as follows:

UNIFORM TRAFFIC CODE OF THE TOWN OF HUNTINGTON  
(INCLUDING SCHEDULE "L")  
CHAPTER 1 (GENERAL PROVISIONS)

ARTICLE I  
DEFINITIONS; WORD USAGE

§1-1. Definitions of words and phrases.

\* \* \*

(B) The following words and phrases, which are not defined by Article I of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York, shall have the following meanings:

\* \* \*

[VEHICLE: ALTERNATIVE FUEL – Any motor vehicle which is powered by clean-burning fuels such as compressed natural gas (CNG); liquefied natural gas (LNG); liquefied petroleum gas (LPG); (propane); hydrogen; electricity (including electricity from solar energy); coal derived liquid fuels; 100% bio-diesel, and any other fuel which is at least 85% alcohol (any kind) including methanol (M85) and denatured ethanol. Alternative fuel vehicles shall include dedicated natural gas vehicles (NGV's) which are designed to run only on natural gas, bi-fuel NGVs which have two separate fueling system enabling these vehicles to use either natural gas or conventional fuel such as gasoline or diesel, and those vehicles which have been retrofitted or converted into an alternative fuel vehicle.]

[VEHICLE, HYBRID ---- Any gas-electric powered motor vehicle.]

ARTICLE III  
(ENFORCEMENT; PENALTIES)

§1-6. Enforcement of parking provisions.

\* \* \*

C. The [Department] Director of Public Safety shall have the power from time to time to adopt [, subject to the approval of the Town Board,] such rules and regulations as may be necessary to accomplish the purposes and enforce the provisions of this Code pertaining to parking.

\* \* \*

§1-7. Penalties.

Any person or business entity who commits any acts in violation of any provision of the Uniform Traffic Code shall be deemed to have committed an offense against this Code and shall be liable for such violation and the penalty therefor and shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine or penalty or imprisonment as follows:

(A) Fifty dollars (\$50) [Twenty-five dollars (\$25)]: §3-6(A) and [(D)] (C); §4-3(G)(2); §4-12.

(B) One hundred dollars (\$100) [Fifty dollars (\$50)] for the first offense; One Hundred fifty dollars (\$150) [Seventy-five dollars (\$75)] for the second offense; One hundred seventy-five dollars (\$175) [One hundred dollars (\$100)] for each and every offense thereafter: §3-2[(A)]; §3-3(A), (D) and (E); §4-1(A)(1) and (C); §4-3(B), (C), (D), (F); [and] (G)(1) and (G)(6); §4-13; §4-14; §4-15.

(C) [One] Two hundred dollars [(\$100)] (\$200): §2-2; §2-3; §3-3(C); §4-1(A)(5); §4-2(C); §4-3(G)(6) .

(H) Not less than two hundred dollars (\$200) [one hundred-fifty dollars (\$150)] and not more than seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$750) [five hundred dollars (\$500)]: §5-2.

(L) Misdemeanor punishable by a fine or penalty of not more than two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500), or by imprisonment not exceeding six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment [§3-6(E); 3-6(F).] §3-6(D) and (E).

ARTICLE V  
SPEED RESTRICTIONS

§2-10. School speed limits.

[The speed limit at which vehicles may proceed along highways and streets or parts thereof passing school buildings and for not more than three hundred (300) feet in either direction from the building line of such school is hereby established as described in Schedule I during the school noon hour or school recess or while children are going to or leaving from school during opening or closing hours.] The speed limit at which vehicles may proceed along highways and streets or parts thereof passing a school building is established in accordance with the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law (Sections 1620(a), 1622, 1630, 1643, 1662-a, 1180(c) as set forth in Schedule I.

ARTICLE III  
METERED PARKING

\* \* \*

§3-6. Use restrictions and regulations.

A. Deposit of fee required. No person shall park a vehicle in a parking meter space of any parking meter zone adjacent to a parking meter during the hours of parking meter operation unless the appropriate fee is immediately deposited in such meter [or a valid hybrid or alternative fuel vehicle permit is properly displayed as provided in this article].

\* \* \*

[C.] [No fee shall be required to be deposited in a parking meter for the parking of any hybrid or alternative fuel vehicle which is registered or leased to a resident of the Town of Huntington, and for which a valid permit has been issued by the Huntington Town Clerk;]

[(1)] [Such permits shall be issued at no fee to applicants and shall not be transferable to another vehicle; and]

[(2)] [All permits shall be valid from the date of issuance to 12:00 midnight on December 31<sup>st</sup> of the year next following the date of issue; and]

[(3)] [All applicants shall present a copy of the vehicle registration card, proper proof of residency and proof to the satisfaction of the Town that the vehicle is a hybrid or alternative fuel vehicle. Motorists who lease a hybrid or alternative fuel vehicle shall present a true copy of the lease and any other proof required by the Town before a permit will be issued; and]

[(4)] [The Director of Public Safety shall provide the Huntington Town Clerk with an updated list of hybrid and alternative fuel vehicles once every three (3) months or sooner if requested by the Town Clerk. In the event a question arises as to whether a vehicle qualifies as a hybrid or alternative fuel vehicle, the decision of the Director of Public Safety shall control and be final; and]

[(5)] [All permits shall be securely affixed to the right, rear passenger-side window of the vehicle, and shall be unobstructed at all times so as to be visible from the street; and]

[(6)] [Notwithstanding any provision of this Article to the contrary, all motorists shall obey the posted time limits for metered parking and all other parking regulations.]<sup>1</sup>

§3-10. Required number of spaces.

Handicapped parking spaces shall be provided pursuant to the following table[:]. Any person or business entity who fails to comply with the provisions of this article shall be deemed to be in violation thereof and shall, upon conviction, be subject to the penalties set forth in this Code.

[§3-19.] [Application of provisions.]

[The provisions of this article shall apply to all nonresidential private parking fields and parking garages open or available for use by the general public.]

[§3-22.] [Designation of spaces.]

[Parking spaces for hybrid and alternative fuel vehicles shall be clearly identified by above-grade signs. Such signs shall be installed and maintained so that the bottom of the signs are at a height not less than five (5) feet nor more than (7) feet from the parking surface. There shall be a minimum of one (1) such sign for each two (2) spaces.]

CHAPTER 4  
PARKING FIELDS

ARTICLE I  
USE REGULATIONS

§4-1. Private parking fields listed in Schedule K.

In accordance with §1660-a of the Vehicle and Traffic Law, traffic and parking regulations are hereby established as follows for the private parking fields listed in Schedule K, pursuant to the written request of either the owner or the person in general charge of the operation and control of such parking fields:

(A) No vehicle shall be stopped, left standing or parked:

\* \* \*

[(5)] [In parking spaces designated as reserved for hybrid or alternative fuel vehicle parking, whether or not the vehicle is occupied, unless a valid permit has been issued by the Huntington Town Clerk and is conspicuously displayed on the vehicle.]

\* \* \*

(C) Additional traffic regulations shall be as described or referred to in Schedule K, and no vehicle shall be operated or parked except in accordance with official signs and/or markings indicating such regulations.

\* \* \*

§4-2. Parking fields in shopping centers or facilities comprising of five or more retail stores and having 20 or more off-street parking spaces.

\* \* \*

[(C)] [No person shall park, leave standing or stop a motor vehicle, whether or not the vehicle is occupied, in a parking space designated for hybrid or alternative fuel vehicles unless a valid permit has been issued by the Huntington Town Clerk and is conspicuously displayed on the vehicle.]

§4-3. Town parking fields.

\* \* \*

(B) Town parking fields. Commuter parking in Town parking fields shall be allowed as follows:

(1) Resident commuter parking. In [those] Town parking fields or parts thereof designated in Schedule L as “resident-commuter parking permit,” no vehicle shall be parked between the hours of 6.00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. of every day, except Saturday, Sunday and holidays, unless properly displaying a valid commuter parking garage permit or a resident commuter parking permit. [resident-commuter parking permit or permit for hybrid or alternative fuel vehicles issued in accordance with the following:]

[(1)] [“Resident commuter permits” shall be issued to residents by the Huntington Town Clerk upon presentation of proper proof of residency and the payment of a non-refundable application fee of fifty (\$50) dollars. Each permit shall be valid from the date of issuance to the next succeeding year on the last calendar day of the month it was issued. All permits shall be securely affixed to the left, rear side window of the vehicle and shall be unobstructed at all times so as to be clearly visible.]

[(2)] [Hybrid or alternative fuel vehicles.]

[(a)] [No application fee shall be required for the parking of any hybrid or alternative fuel vehicle which is registered or leased to a resident of Town of Huntington. All applicants shall present a copy of the vehicle registration card, proper proof of residency and proof to the satisfaction of the Town that the vehicle is a hybrid or alternative fuel vehicle. Motorists who lease a hybrid or alternative fuel vehicle shall present a copy of the lease and any other proof required by the Town before a permit will be issued by the Huntington Town Clerk. Such permits are not transferable to another vehicle and shall be valid from the date of issuance to 12:00 midnight on December 31<sup>st</sup> of the year next following the date of issue.]

[(b)] [The Director of Public Safety shall provide the Huntington Town Clerk with an undated list of hybrid and alternative fuel vehicles once every three (3) months or sooner if requested by the Town Clerk. In the event a question arises as to whether a vehicle qualifies as a hybrid or alternative fuel vehicle, the decision of the Director of Public Safety shall control and be final.]

[(c)] [All such permits shall be securely affixed to the right, rear passenger-side window of the vehicle and shall be unobstructed at all times so as to be clearly visible.]

(2) Non-resident commuter parking. In Town parking fields or parts thereof designated in Schedule L as “non-resident-commuter parking permit” no vehicle shall be parked between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. of every day, except Saturday, Sunday and holidays, unless properly displaying a valid resident or non-resident commuter parking permit, or a commuter parking garage permit.

(C) Town parking garages. In [those] Town parking [fields] garages designated in Schedule L, [as “commuter-permit,”] no vehicle shall be parked [between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. of every day, except Saturday, Sunday and holidays,] unless properly displaying a commuter parking garage permit [resident permit, as described in Subsection B above, or a nonresident permit issued in accordance with the following:]

[(1)] [Nonresident permits, valid for a period of one year commencing on September 1 of each year, shall be issued by the Town Clerk.]

[(2)] [The fee for nonresident permits shall be established by a Town Board resolution and shall be for a period of one full year or any part thereof. This fee shall be nonrefundable.]

[(3)] [Permits shall be securely affixed to the inside of the left rear side window behind the driver of the vehicle to be parked.]

(D) Marina parking. In those Town parking fields designated in Schedule L as “marina parking,” no vehicle shall be parked unless properly displaying a marina parking permit issued by the Department of Parks and Recreation.

(E) Metered parking. Town parking fields or parts thereof designated in Schedule L as “metered parking” shall be subject to the provisions of Chapter [TC3, Parking Regulations, Article III, Metered Parking,] 3, Article III of this Code.

(F) Daily parking. In those Town parking fields or parts thereof designated in Schedule L as “daily parking,” no vehicle shall be parked unless the requisite non-

refundable fee has been paid. The fee for daily parking shall be [five (\$5)] ~~ten (\$10)~~ dollars for up to twenty-four (24) hours. A reduced fee of [two dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50)] ~~five (\$5) dollars~~ shall be applicable in designated handicapped parking stalls for those properly displaying a valid handicapped parking permit, and for any vehicle [vehicles] properly displaying a valid Senior Citizen Identification Card[s] issued by the Town of Huntington.

[(1)] [Hybrid or alternative fuel vehicles.]

[(a)] [No fee shall be required for the parking of any hybrid or alternative fuel vehicle which is registered or leased to a resident of the Town of Huntington. All applicants shall present a copy of the vehicle registration card proper proof of residency and proof to the satisfaction of the Town that the vehicle is a hybrid or alternative fuel vehicle. Motorists who lease a hybrid or alternative fuel vehicle shall present a copy of the lease and any other proof required by the Town before a permit will be issued by the Huntington Town Clerk. Such permits are not transferable to another vehicle and shall be valid from the date of issuance to 12:00 midnight on December 31<sup>st</sup> of the year next following the date of issue.]

[(b)] [The Director of Public Safety shall provide the Huntington Town Clerk with an undated list of hybrid and alternative fuel vehicles once every three (3) months or sooner if requested by the Town Clerk. In the event a question arises as to whether a vehicle qualifies as a hybrid or alternative fuel vehicle, the decision of the Director of Public Safety shall control and be final.]

[(c)] [All such permits shall be securely affixed to the right, rear passenger-side window of the vehicle and shall be unobstructed at all times so as to be clearly visible.]

(G) In any Town parking garage or parking field, no vehicle shall be stopped, left standing or parked:

(1) In any manner other than as designated on the surface thereof by appropriate markings as described in [§TC3-2] §3-2.

(6) [In parking spaces designated as reserved for hybrid or alternative fuel vehicles, whether or not the vehicle is occupied, unless a valid permit has been issued by the Huntington Town Clerk and is conspicuously displayed on the vehicle.] In any manner other than in a “head-in” fashion or position.

§4-4. through §4-10. (Reserved)

## ARTICLE II COMMUTER PARKING

§4-11. Permit Requirements. All commuter permits shall be issued by the Huntington Town Clerk, upon the following conditions and on such other conditions as the Town Clerk deems advisable:

(A) Commuter parking garage permit. A commuter parking garage permit shall be issued upon the payment of a non-refundable permit fee of six hundred (\$600) dollars per year, presentation of proper proof of residency, and current vehicle registration to the Huntington Town Clerk. Such permit shall be available to residents of the Town and non-residents and shall be valid from the day of issuance to the next succeeding year on the last calendar day of the month it was issued, unless sooner terminated.

(B) Resident commuter parking permit. A resident commuter parking permit shall be issued upon the payment of a non-refundable permit fee of seventy-five (\$75) dollars, presentation of proper proof of residency, and current vehicle registration to the Huntington Town Clerk. Such permit shall be valid from the day of issuance to the next succeeding year on the last calendar day of the month it was issued, unless sooner terminated.

(C) Non-resident commuter parking permit. A non-resident commuter parking permit shall be issued upon the payment of a non-refundable permit fee of one hundred (\$100) dollars, presentation of proper proof of residency, and current vehicle registration to the Huntington Town Clerk. Such permit shall be valid for one full year, or any part thereof, commencing on September 1 of each year, unless sooner terminated.

§4-12. Placement and removal of permit. All permits shall be properly and securely affixed to the inside of the upper left corner of the rear window of the vehicle for which it was issued, and shall be unobstructed at all times so as to be clearly visible. All expired parking permits shall be removed from the vehicle upon expiration. A permit holder who fails to post or remove a permit in compliance with this section shall be in violation of this chapter.

§4-13. Non-transferability of permit. No person shall permit or allow a permit to be posted on a vehicle other than the vehicle for which the permit was issued. Such permit shall be null and void. The person or entity to whom the permit was originally issued and the owner of the vehicle where the permit has been unlawfully posted shall be strictly liable for a violation of this chapter.

§4-14. Alteration of permit. It shall be unlawful to alter, obscure, deface, change or otherwise tamper with any portion of a parking permit issued pursuant to this chapter.
