I oppose this application because any further damage to this environmentally sensitive land, surrounded by the Wetlands, The Long Island Sound and The Fresh Pond Greenbelt Critical Environmental Area, will be irreversible. The nitrogen and phosphorus levels produced by the golf course alone already exceed the levels that are estimated would be generated by R-40 zoned single family houses. The introduction of the additional 12.9 acres of impervious surfaces included in the plan will worsen an existing runoff problem. In addition to further polluting water bodies, this development denudes the property of 10.88 acres of trees and will exacerbate slumping of the bluff in the Coastal Hazard Erosion Zone. This plan is most certainly a threat to the delicate ecosystem.
