RECYCLING GUIDELINES

GLASS, PLASTIC & METAL:

- RINSE glass, plastic, and metal recyclables clean, put into any rigid container with a Town recycling sticker and place curbside on the days indicated by this calendar.
- If you need a replacement for your blue bin, RECYCLE stickers are available from Town Hall, the Town's Recycling Center, and all libraries in the Town. These can be affixed to any garbage container of 39 gallons or less.



- Please make DRAINAGE holes in all containers.
- Recyclables in plastic bags will NOT be collected.

STYROFOAM can be dropped off at the Town's Recycling Center – 641 New York Avenue (see page 17 for more information)

PLASTIC PACKAGING FILL can be recycled. Call 1-800-828-2214 for the location of the nearest package store or business which accepts plastic loose fill for reuse.

JUNK MAIL, CARDBOARD & NEWSPAPER:

- Junk Mail, Newspapers, and Magazines MUST BE TIED into bundles no more than 12 inches high OR put in PAPER grocery bags. NO PLASTIC BAGS.



- All cardboard boxes MUST BE FLATTENED and TIED into bundles no more than 4 feet OR placed in a dedicated recycling container 39 gallons or less.

A MESSAGE FROM SUPERVISOR FRANK P. PETRONE

Dear Fellow Huntington Resident:

On behalf of my colleagues on the Town Board, I am pleased to present our **2013 Trash Pickup and Recycling Calendar**. This easy-to-follow guide contains detailed information on our trash collection system and recycling programs. The calendar is designed to ensure that your refuse and recycling service is efficient, user-friendly, and convenient. By following this calendar and adhering to the simple rules and regulations, you assist in the system's continued success.

Thanks to your cooperation and commitment, the Town of Huntington remains a leading municipality on Long Island when it comes to recycling. For example, in 2012, our residents recycled an estimated 9300 tons of paper and cardboard; 4900 tons of commingled glass bottles, plastics and metal cans; over 140 tons of electronic waste; and composted over 20,000 tons of yard waste. The more we recycle the greater the benefit for the environment.

You may notice a change in the layout of this calendar. This is not the only change coming in 2013. In an effort to reduce operating expenses the Town has decided to suspend garbage collection on two holidays in 2013. Garbage collection is being suspended on February 18th, President's Day, and October 14th, Columbus Day. Residents who have previously had their trash picked up on these days are advised to adjust their schedules accordingly. Other observed holidays remain unchanged with trash pickup being delayed a day due to the holiday. Additionally the Town has chosen to reduce the number of weeks that yard waste is collected. Please check the calendar regularly to confirm that yard waste is being collected that week.

I would also like to make you aware of an existing program that is important for all residents. "Huntington Alert" is the Town of Huntington's Notification System for weather and public safety emergencies. It is used when the Town and its Agencies need to provide you with urgent information and instructions. While the Town uses a database with many listed telephone numbers, we do not have unlisted numbers and you need to sign up by clicking the Huntington Alert link on the Town's home page. Also, if you would like us to contact you at some other number, you should also click on the link and fill out the requested information. You can also give us your cell phone for text messages and your e-mail address.

For additional information on Town services, departments, programs, news highlights, and meeting times, please check the Town's web site at www.huntingtonny.gov. If you happen to misplace this calendar, you can always refer to the web site. A copy may be downloaded from a link on the home page.

As always, we welcome your comments and input. Please contact us on the web through "Huntington @ Your Service." As with the sign up for Huntington Alert, you can access Huntington @ Your Service from the home page of the Town's website. Look for the Huntington @ Your Service icon at the top of the page. BASIC CURBSIDE COLLECTION SERVICE & REGULATIONS

DO:

- Place up to six garbage cans (UNDER 39 GALLONS in volume), bags, or bundles each weighing LESS THAN 50 lbs. at the curb for collection on your two weekly garbage pickup days.
- Garbage collections begin at 6:00 a.m.
- Place covered garbage cans curbside NO EARLIER THAN 6:00 p.m. THE EVENING BEFORE collection.
- Town Code requires that emptied garbage cans be REMOVED FROM THE STREET NO LATER THAN 12:00 p.m. the day after pickup and all garbage cans must be stored behind the front line of your dwelling on non-collection days.
- Place up to FOUR (4) BULK ITEMS at the curb on your SECOND GARBAGE COLLECTION DAY of the week. A bulk item is any object (other than appliances and large metal items) weighing more than 50 lbs. or larger than 2 x 2 x 4 ft.
- Call your carter to arrange PICKUP OF APPLIANCE AND LARGE METAL ITEMS. Please do not place items at the curb until the night before your scheduled pickup collection date.
- Place RECYCLABLES at the curb for COLLECTION ON WEDNESDAYS – paper one week and mixed recyclables the next – according to this calendar. The Wednesday recycling day changes during HOLIDAY WEEKS, so please remember to consult the calendar for your pickup day.
- Place bundles or garbage cans of YARD WASTE at the curb for collection on the weeks indicated by a leaf.
 - BRANCHES must be tied in bundles no larger than 2 x 2 x 4 ft.; leaves and clippings must be bagged or placed in uncovered cans.
 - Grass is NOT collected.

DO NOT:

- Use BUNGEE CORDS (to secure can lids) or use any container larger than 39 gallons, or heavier than 50 lbs. when full. Do not fill your yard waste container to more than 12" above the rim.
- Place MORE ITEMS at the curb than this schedule allows. It is a violation of the Town Code. This includes move-ins and move-outs. For amounts exceeding collection limits, alternative disposal must be arranged (either self-haul or hiring a roll-off).
- Place items at curbside PRIOR TO 6:00 p.m. the evening before your scheduled collection day. It is a violation of the Town Code.
- Place large amounts of remodeling or construction DEBRIS, cement stones, and/or dirt out for pickup. For amounts exceeding your collection service limits, you must make alternate disposal arrangements (either self-haul or hiring a roll-off).
- Place any refuse, bulk, yard waste, or recycling out for collection IN FRONT OF ANYONE ELSE'S PROPERTY.

Town residents can ensure the continued health and safety of our drinking water and the environment by bringing their hazardous household wastes to the Town's **STOP** Facility. The **STOP** Facility is located at the **Town Recycling Center**:

641 New York Avenue, Huntington
 (¼ mile north of Big H Shopping Center)
 Hours: Tuesday – Saturday 9:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m.

When bringing hazardous waste to the **STOP** Facility:

- Bring waste in its original container if possible. Secure items for transport.
- Bring a maximum of 5 gallons of hazardous waste per person per day.
- Do not leave waste in a hot, unventilated vehicle for long periods of time.
- Do not smoke near chemical products.

ELECTRONIC WASTE

New York State law requires manufacturers to take responsibility for recycling many types of electronic equipment they have produced, such as: COMPUTERS, MONITORS, KEYBOARDS, MICE, SCANNERS, FACSIMILE MACHINES, PRINTERS, TELEVISIONS, and SMALL SCALE SERVERS.

Manufacturers must now provide free and convenient acceptance programs for NYS consumers to properly reuse and recycle their waste electronic equipment.

Beginning January 15, 2015, electronic waste may NOT be placed at the curb for pickup. In advance of the disposal ban, the Town of Huntington is asking all residents to begin recycling their E-waste by participating in the manufacturer sponsored program or by utilizing the

TOWN CODE STANDARDS

Oversized Garbage Cans and/or Bungee Cords are illegal and poses a danger to carters.

It is a violation of the Town Code to place at curbside garbage receptacles that are either oversized or overweight. These cans and lids secured with bungee cords have been known to cause serious work-related injuries to our sanitation collectors. Always use the correct-sized garbage can. For our residents' benefit, the actual Town Code Regulation pertaining to this is reprinted here:


Town Code Standards for Storage of Waste Prior to its Collection:

It shall be the responsibility of the owner, tenant, or occupant of a residential property to provide receptacles of sufficient capacity to contain the solid waste ordinarily generated of that property during ninety-six (96) consecutive hours. The receptacles shall be kept closed and maintained in good and sanitary condition by periodic cleaning, and, when filled, each receptacle shall not exceed fifty (50) pounds in total weight or thirty-nine (39) gallons in volume.

BATTERY DISPOSAL

The New York State Rechargeable Battery Recycling Act (NYS ECL § 27-1805) bans any person to knowingly dispose of rechargeable batteries as solid waste AND requires businesses who sell rechargeable batteries to collect and recycle the batteries statewide at no cost to consumers. Most rechargeable batteries contain toxic metals that can be released into the environment when improperly disposed.



Retailers will accept up to ten used rechargeable batteries per day from any person regardless of whether the person purchases replacement batteries. Retailers will also accept as many batteries as a consumer purchases from the retailer.

The following rechargeable batteries are covered by this law:

Non-rechargeable batteries, such as 9V, A, AA, AAA, C, and D batteries can be disposed of with your household trash.

BULK COLLECTION

You may place up to FOUR bulk items on your SECOND garbage collection day of the week. A BULK ITEM is any object heavier than 50 lbs. or larger than 2 x 2 x 4 feet.

INCLUDE: Sofa, mattress, carpet,* rimless tire, railroad ties,* stockade fencing,* upholstered chairs, console televisions.

*These items must be cut in four-foot lengths, rolled, bundled, and tied.

GRASS RECYCLING

1. Allow your lawn to grow at least three inches high. When mowing cut no more than one inch off the top. Mow only when the grass is dry.
2. Leave the grass clippings in place - DO NOT BAG THEM. The clippings decompose quickly, are a natural fertilizer, keep the lawn moist, and protect against disease.
3. Water your lawn in the early morning hours (between 6:00 and 10:00 a.m.) Water a maximum of three to four hours per week, less if it rains.
4. Don't over-fertilize. Grass clippings left in place actually fertilize your lawn. Fertilizer need be applied only three times a year – around Memorial Day, Labor Day, and Thanksgiving.
5. Keep your mower blade sharp and consider investing a mulching blade for your current lawn mower. These blades cut and recut the grass more finely and greatly aid the decomposition process. When it comes time for a new mower, consider replacing it with a mulching or recycling mower.

ITEMS ACCEPTED:

Construction and demolition debris, scrap metal, appliances, yard waste (excluding grass), waste oil, porcelain toilets, basins and sink fixtures, and recyclables. Fees may apply.

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED:

Household trash, furniture, mattresses, box springs, tires, carpets, padding, textile items, stumps weighing over 40 lbs., hypodermic needles and hazardous materials.

NOTE: Smithtown does not follow the same holiday schedule as Huntington. It is recommended that residents telephone 631-269-6600 to ensure the landfill is open before bringing items for disposal.

ITEMS ACCEPTED:

Textiles, Styrofoam, antifreeze, automotive and marine batteries, motor oil, clean paper, plastic, newspaper, cardboard, glass, and cans.

Grass clippings are accepted for a fee of \$2.00/bag.

TEXTILE RECYCLING REGULATIONS:

- The Recycling Center's CLOTHING DROP BOX will accept ONLY clean, dry items. Soiled, rotted, or moldy clothes will contaminate the entire load.
- Between 50 and 90 percent of all clothing dropped off will be reused as clothing in its original form. The remaining textiles will be made into wiping rags, batting, or roofing material.
- Textiles include clothes, hats, belts, sheets, quilts, handbags, blankets, bedspreads, curtains, towels, socks, and paired shoes.
- Huntington Residents are urged to recycle old clothing and other textiles either by using the charitable drop boxes or by bringing them to the Town Recycling Center.

BARBECUE PROPANE TANK RECYCLING:

- The Town Recycling Center will accept (at no charge) up to 25 lb. propane gas tanks for safe disposal.
- For safety reasons, these tanks MUST NEVER be disposed in normal trash.
- Tanks will be reconditioned and/or recycled for scrap metal.

COMPACT FLUORESCENT LIGHTS DISPOSAL

Compact Fluorescent Lights (CFL's) are energy efficient bulbs that use 75% less energy than traditional incandescent bulbs and last up to ten times longer. While they are good for reducing energy people should also be aware that CFL's contain very small amounts of mercury. If these bulbs are discarded in normal trash or curbside recycling containers after they burn out they will break and could release mercury into the environment.

STORM PREPAREDNESS

The Atlantic Hurricane season begins June 1st and runs through November 30th. It is everyone's responsibility to be vigilant during hurricane season. Typically, Long Island is considered vulnerable in the later part of the season, September and October, but as we have experienced no hurricane is typical and can occur at anytime. We want all residents, business owners, and visitors to be prepared in the event of an emergency.

The Town's website, www.huntingtonny.gov has important information and a **Hurricane Preparedness Handbook** available for download. Additionally residents can sign up for "Huntington Alert" on the website as well. "Huntington Alert" is the Town of Huntington's Notification System for weather and public safety emergencies. It will be used when the Town and its Agencies need to provide you with urgent information and instructions.

While the Town uses a database with many listed telephone numbers, we do not have unlisted numbers and you need to sign up on the website. Also, if you would like us to contact you at some other number, you should also click on the link and fill out the requested information. You can also give us your cell phone for text messages and your e-mail address.

YARD WASTE COLLECTION

- In accordance with the TOWN CODE, GRASS is not included in your curbside collection program.
- YARD WASTE will be collected only on scheduled weeks. Put out yard waste the night before it's scheduled pickup.
- LEAVES should be placed in bags or uncovered cans.
- BRANCHES must be bundled and tied. All bundles must weigh 50 lbs. or less. Bundles can be no larger than 2 x 2 x 4 feet. No single branch can be more than 6 inches in diameter.

INCLUDE:

Leaves, bundled branches, brush, plant trimmings and prunings, tree limbs less than six inches in diameter.

EXCLUDE:

GRASS, stumps, sod, lumber, dirt, rocks, root balls, limbs exceeding six inches in diameter. Bagged grass clippings can be brought to the TOWN RECYCLING CENTER for a fee of \$2.00 per bag (see page 17). Other material may be brought to the Smithtown Landfill (see page 15).

YARD WASTE SCHEDULE

(Grass is NOT included)

If you live in Area #1 through #16 and have:

- Monday – Thursday trash pickup, your yard waste day is Friday
- Tuesday – Friday trash pickup, your yard waste day is Thursday

If you live in Area #17 and have:

- Monday – Thursday trash pickup and live **west of New York Avenue**, your yard waste day is Tuesday
- Monday – Thursday trash pickup and live **east of New York Avenue**, your yard waste day is Thursday
- Tuesday – Friday trash pickup and live **west of New York Avenue**, your yard waste day is Monday
- Tuesday – Friday trash pickup and live **east of New York Avenue and north of the LIRR tracks**, your yard waste day is Wednesday
- Tuesday – Friday trash pickup and live **east of New York Avenue and south of the LIRR tracks**, your yard waste day is Friday

If you live in Area #19 and have:

- Monday – Thursday trash pickup, your yard waste day is Thursday

NOTE: Due to the excessive volume of yard waste set out between November 1st and December 31st, your yard waste collection day will vary. You will receive a **minimum** of one collection per week during this time, **on any day** Monday through Saturday. Please be patient during this time.

DISPOSAL OF UNUSED MEDICINES & PRESCRIPTION PHARMACEUTICALS

Medicines play an important role in treating many conditions and diseases, but when they are no longer needed it's important to dispose of them properly to avoid harm to others. Below are some disposal options and some special disposal instructions for you to consider when throwing out expired, unwanted, or unused medicines.



Medicine Take-Back Programs

The Suffolk County Police Department has a take back program called OPERATION MEDICINE CABINET. Residents can drop off expired or unwanted drugs, keeping our seniors, kids, pets and the environment safe.


Disposal in Household Trash

Consumers can also follow these simple steps to dispose of most prescription medicines in their household trash:

- Mix medicines (do NOT crush tablets or capsules) with an unpalatable substance such as kitty litter or used coffee grounds;
- Place the mixture in a container such as a sealed plastic bag; and
- Throw the container in your household trash

PROPER DISPOSAL OF HOUSEHOLD SHARPS

Many community residents use SHARPS – hypodermic needles, lancets, or other instruments – to manage their health care at home. Proper disposal of these instruments protects family members and our sanitation workers from accidental injury.



NEVER DISPOSE OF LOOSE SHARPS IN NORMAL HOUSEHOLD TRASH

If you use household SHARPS to manage your diabetes or other medical conditions, please follow these procedures for proper disposal.

- Use a puncture-proof plastic container with a tight-fitting screw top. Plastic soda bottles and bleach/laundry detergent containers all work well.
- Do not use glass containers or coffee cans.
- Label the container clearly. Write "CONTAINS SHARPS" with a waterproof marker directly on the containers, or masking tape on the container.
- After using the syringe or lancet, immediately put it into the container. Screw the top on. Do not clip, bend or recap needles because you may injure yourself.
- Keep container away from children.
- When the container is full, screw on the top tightly. Seal with heavy duty tape.
- Place the sealed container with your regular refuse for safe disposal.
